Cirencester

A lovely market town with a fascinating history. Lots of independent cafes and shops to wander around. See some highlights of places of things to do/see New Brewery Arts, Corinium Museum and the Lido. More info below.

Corinium Museum

Discover the treasures of the Cotswolds as you explore its history at this Award Winning Museum. Home to one of the largest collections of Romano-British antiquities extensively from Corinium, Roman Britain's second largest city.

New Brewery Arts

New Brewery Arts is the home of craft and making in the heart of the Cotswolds, with galleries, artists' studios, café and shop, and guest accommodation, and an extensive programme of courses and workshops (over 200 each year). Admission is free.

Cirencester Lido

Located on the edge of Cirencester Park, this open air pool has a 28 metre main pool with slide, separate children's paddling pool, sunbathing patio as well as hot and cold refreshments, picnics welcome.

Cotswold Water Park

Set in 40 square miles of Wiltshire and Gloucestershire countryside, this unique area of over 150 lakes known as the Cotswold Water Park has something for everyone – from watersports and land activities, fantastic and varied birdwatching, excellent angling, off road cycling, an inland beach, peaceful lakeside walks to beautiful Cotswold towns and villages waiting to be explored.

Chedworth Roman Villa

Cradled in a beautiful Cotswold valley rest the remains of one of the grandest Roman villas in Britain.

Within half an hour of the farm...

Cotswold Wildlife Park

Get eye-to-eye with giraffe, watch rhinos grazing on Gothic Manor House lawns or walk with lemurs. With over 260 different animal species in over 120 acres of beautiful Parkland & gardens, there's plenty of space to relax and get closer to wildlife!

The Garden at Miserden

This lovely, timeless garden designed in the 17th century has a wonderful sense of peace and tranquillity with a topiary yew walk and grass steps designed by Lutyens, as well as magnificent mixed borders. Coffee, cakes and light lunches in an old glasshouse and plant nursery too.

Cotswold Sculpture Park

Ten acres of lush grounds with dozens of sculptures amongst mixed deciduous and conifer woodland with ponds, gardens and glades. Joining these diverse spaces are meandering paths that take you on a journey around the park providing an international centre for contemporary art. Poppins tea room with delicious homemade cakes, sandwiches etc. The whole place is an absolute joy to visit.

Westonbirt Arboretum

Westonbirt is a remarkable place for people to enjoy and learn about trees. Borne of a Victorian passion for plant collecting, around 15,000 trees from all over the globe now offer the perfect setting to escape, relax or have an adventure...

Crickley Hill Country Park

Managed jointly by the National Trust and Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust, the park is a haven for nature and home to many birds, reptiles and mammals and is recognised as a Site of Special Scientific Interest for its wonderful variety of wildflowers. Rising above the city of Gloucester, Crickley Hill it also boasts breathtaking views over the Severn Vale, the Brecon Beacons and Black Mountain.

Food and Drink...

The New Inn, Coln St Aldwyn

Traditional Cotswold country pub with a twist ~ homemade burgers, craft beers and fine wines. Relaxed informal atmosphere

The Stump, Fosse Cross

Delicious pizza, pasta and craft beer, sister pub to the New Inn and similar vibe.
1hr 45min walk from the farm.

The Bathurst Arm, North Cerney

An award winning pub, being the first pub to achieve 5 stars with the Soil Associations "Organic Served Here" scheme. Purchasing over 95% of organic food from local farms and suppliers (including us!)
1hr walk from the farm.

Village Pub, Barnsley

Our most local pub and a smart one at that! Good for special occasions
1hr walk from the farm.

Temple Mama

Bringing South East Asian style food to Cirencester, great for brunch, lunch, drinks and cakes. Expect a culinary melting pot of diverse flavours using robust, fresh and local produce rooted deep with chef/owner Ting's Singapore heritage.
